Notes:

Unused residential aged care places are places which have been operational in the past, but as at 30 June 2021 are not providing care due to reasons like renovations or rebuilding of residential aged care facilities and the provider is receiving no Australian Government subsidy for these places. In previous years, unused places have been referred to as "offline". This terminology has been amended to better align with the language used to regulate these places in the *Aged Care Act 1997*.

Note: Following the Increasing Choices changes on 27 February 2017, places for the Home Care Packages Program are now assigned to consumers and not to services. Correspondingly, places data for the Home Care Packages Program are no longer captured in the stocktake.

^{*} Table includes flexible residential aged care places in the: Multi-Purpose Service (MPS) Program, Aged Care Innovative Pool Program and the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Flexible Aged Care Program.
